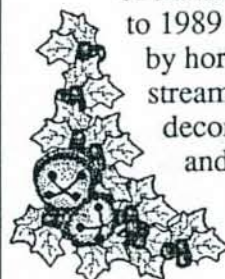

of transition from 1988 to 1989 was marked by horn blowing, streamer throwing, decorative hats, and the singing of Auld Lang Syne.

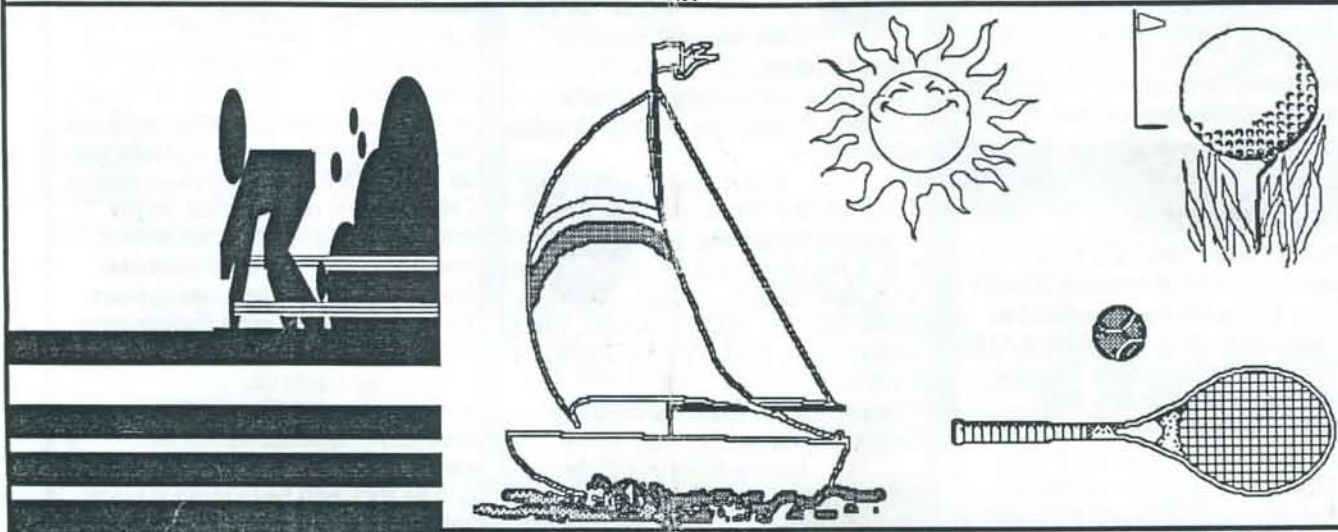

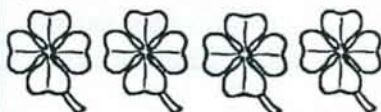
WAITER/WAITRESS RACE - media members will ski down the hill carrying a tray with a glass of water on it. The trick will be to make it to the bottom without a spill.

X-COUNTRY 1988-89

The 8 km groomed loop has been improved by the addition of new culverts and fill on some of the steeper sections. Also, a branch trail has been built to join the loop trail with a trail along the Madawaska River. This new section will be used for guided outings during the 1988-89 season and will enable groups to ski from the Peaks along the Madawaska River as far as the Bailey Fields - a distance of about 10 km.

Plans are being made to organize a X-Country race in early February.

SKI BOOGIES

The Ski Boogies program is a full day program for the seven to fourteen year old child. Children who wish to startskiing

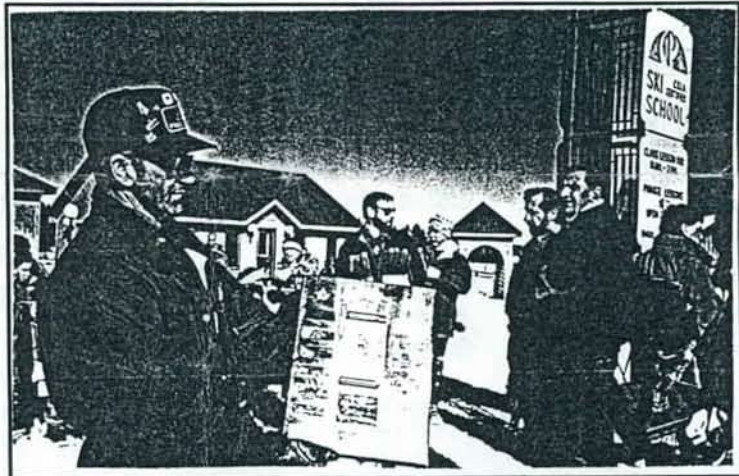
as well as the parallel skier are taught in compatible groups of seven to eight kids by a CSIA instructor. The children are supervised from the time they board the bus (fare is included) in the morning until they disembark on their return in late afternoon. Their instructor will be with the group throughout the day including the lunch period. Lunch is also provided in this program.

As the group is together with the instructor throughout the day, group dynamics is a critical part of the learning process. *The teaching is geared to the group - what the group needs, THE GROUP GETS* - and in addition there is a lot of supervised

practice time.

NANCY GREENE

The Nancy Greene program is a structured program running for two hours in the morning and for two hours in the afternoon. The students are free during the rest of the day and may ski and practice on their own. The program accepts children six to twelve years of age. Again they can be beginner skiers or parallel skiers. The Nancy Greene program includes team ski racing as a means to improving the child's ski technique. It works extremely well, and some of Canada's top ski racers have come from out of this program.
