

Summer Improvements

We are going to be busy this summer at the Peaks, working to make your '86-'87 ski season the best one yet. Snowmaking facilities will be expanded again, with a pipeline up Whistlin' Paddy to ensure good snow top to bottom, and more portable snow guns to increase coverage. With this increase in snowmaking we hope to extend our season. To this end we are programming to build an offloading ramp at tower 9 on the chairlift so we can open the bottom half of Whistlin' Paddy for early and late season skiing.
